A PERSONAL OPINION BY AN HKDA MEMBER ON ANCILLARY DENTAL PERSONNEL (LEGCO'S MEETING 13 SEPTEMBER 1999)

Enclosed please find relevant comments to information provided, please refer to whoever will attend the above meeting esp. Dr C.H. Leong.

- 1. HKDA (dental practitioners rep.) & ADP are not "opposite" in relation to ADP registration. HKDA urge the Government to properly address all queries including grandfather clause (e.g. Chinese Medicine case - suitability to apply in this situation?), training (eg. Government prepared to fund all appropriate training of ADP, including on the job training such as subsidy to employer or taxation provision/allowance for employer), career prospect for all ADP post registration (eg. Ensuring no existing ADP will lose his/her job because of the registration process).
- 2. HKDA stance has always been all ADP should be under the jurisdiction of the existing Dental Council as all classes ADP worked under the instructions or direct supervision of comprehensively trained dentist - ONLY ONE SET OF DENTAL ORDINANCE (ic DRO)
 - ⇒ Best way to protect public health [additional benefit: ADP more economical to register] [more cost-effective]/ [government easier to manage]
- 3. Comparison to U.K. GDC recently proposed ADP registration can only be justified if HKSAR Government plan to have similar National Health Policy of U.K.: extensive use of ADP aim to economise the NHS dental service provision.

Conclusion:

HKSAR government should have comprehensive review of dental services (public/private) provisions including (but not limited to) the supply/demand of all types of dental personnel (eg fully trained dentists, ADP & any other personnel in relation)
