- (b) The draft estimate of \$2,087,000 under Subhead 002 Allowances is made up of \$2,001,000 for standard allowances and \$86,000 for nonstandard allowance. Standard allowances cover acting allowance, overtime allowance and typhoon allowance. Non-standard allowance covers consolidated overtime allowance for a Chauffeur in EFB.
- (c) The draft estimate of \$86,000 for non-standard allowance is wholly (i.e. 100%) for payment of overtime allowance for the Chauffeur.

- (b) FEHD's food surveillance programme monitors the presence of pollutants, including heavy metals and persistent organic pollutants, in local fish and shellfish. Samples of these items are taken from points of sale for testing. If the testing shows that a sample fails to meet the safety standards, FEHD

will take action against the food seller concerned. The data collected are analysed to facilitate risk assessment and management and long-term planning of food safety strategies.

(c) FEHD will disseminate the findings of the programme to the public through media briefings, press releases, a hotline and the Internet.

Reply :

(a)In the Environment and Food Bureau, aquaculture is included in the programme area Food Supply and Food Safety which has a provision of \$17.4 million in 2000-01. The Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) is provided with funding amounting to \$19.9 million in 2000-01 for implementing measures relating to aquaculture.

(b)Research on aquaculture is undertaken by AFCD. This covers trials on the production of marine fish fry, identification of suitable new fish species, fish disease diagnosis, and control of and improvements to fish feed formula.

(c)About 4% of fish consumed in Hong Kong comes from local aquaculture.

(d) AFCD monitors water quality in fish culture zones to ensure that the water there is suitable for aquaculture purpose. In addition, the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department has a food surveillance programme to monitor fish and shellfish products to ensure that they are safe for human consumption. Tests are conducted on fish and shellfish for the presence of pollutants (including heavy metals and persistent organic pollutants). In general, antibiotics as a group are not internationally regarded as hazards in seafood. We understand that research on the genetically modification of fish is still at an experimental stage.

(a) This is covered by the provision of \$17.4 million in 2000-01 under the programme area Food Supply and Food Safety. The Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) and the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) carry out screening and testing of livestocks in farms and slaughterhouses for clenbuterol to ensure that carcasses and offals unfit for human consumption would not enter the market. Recurrent provision of \$6.3 million and \$7 million are allocated to AFCD and FEHD respectively in 2000-01 for these activities.

- (b) No unregistered drugs (including clenbuterol) are allowed in livestock feeds. Furthermore, testing of livestocks in farms and slaughterhouses and inspection of meat at retail outlets are being conducted to safeguard consumers' health.
- (c) The labelling and testing system implemented by AFCD and FEHD has effectively prevented pigs contaminated with clenbuterol from entering the market. The percentage of unsatisfactory pork samples containing clenbuterol dropped significantly from 12.5% in 1998 to 1.1% in 1999. FEHD also monitors the levels of other chemical residues in meat and poultry. In the past three years, all the meat and poultry samples tested were free of chemical pollutants.
- (d) We plan to introduce new regulations to control the use of chemicals for feeding food animals.

Reply :

For the year 2000-01, the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) has included a provision of \$4,466.5 million for performing the functions under the four programme areas.

It is not possible to provide a direct comparison of FEHD's financial provision for 2000-01 with the expenditure under the Provisional Municipal Councils (PMCs) in the past two years, major reasons being:

- (a) FEHD has taken on new and additional functions and responsibilities;
- (b) as the PMCs were financially autonomous, all expenditure pertaining to areas under their jurisdiction was borne by them. However, with the reorganization of municipal services and the setting up of FEHD, part of such

expenditure is no longer necessary e.g. staff on-costs and part of such expenditure now comes under other Heads of expenditure e.g. building maintenance is now funded under Head 25 (Architectural Services Department);

- (c) for the year 1999-2000, there is only nine months expenditure under the PMCs as the reorganization of municipal services took place on 1 January 2000; and
- (d) the PMCs did not classify expenditure in the same way as FEHD's programme areas. Expenditure was classified under different select committees (14 in Provisional Urban Council (PUC) and 5 in Provisional Regional Council (Pro RC)). It is hence not possible to make a direct comparison.

Notwithstanding the above, expenditure for the PMCs in 1998-99 and 1999-2000 pertaining to food safety and environmental hygiene are provided below for reference:

It should be noted that the above exclude common and administration expenses of the former PMCs which also supported leisure and cultural activities now under Leisure and Cultural Services Department.

EFB is a newly established policy bureau which deals with different policy areas. For the policy areas of "Food Supply and Food Safety" and "Environmental Hygiene", the proposed provisions for EFB for 2000-01 are \$17.4 million and \$16.1 million respectively. It should be noted that apart from FEHD, there are other departments which work also contributes to these policy areas, e.g. Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department."

Reply:

We promote the sustainable development of the fishing industry by -

- (a) enhancing fisheries resources and marine habitats through placing artificial reefs,
- (b) enforcing the Fisheries Protection Ordinance, Cap. 171 to prohibit destructive fishing in Hong Kong,
- (c) minimizing the impact of development on fisheries resources through the Environmental Impact Assessment process, and
- (d) enhancing public awareness in fisheries conservation through education and publicity activities.

In addition, we are formulating a comprehensive fisheries management strategy in consultation with the Working Group on Fisheries Management comprising representatives from the fishing industry, green groups and the academics. Fisheries management proposals being considered by the Working Group include setting up a fishing licence system and establishing fisheries protection areas in Tolo Harbour (including Tolo Channel) and Port Shelter, mainly to protect fish spawning and nursery areas.

This five-hectare site covers the Tai Ho Stream and part of the Tai Ho Wan. The stream supports a high diversity of fresh water and brackish-water fish. The mangrove and seagrass in the bay are also of high ecological value.

4. Sham Wan, Lamma Island

The site covers 4 hectares of sandy beach and the adjoining sea area. It is the only nesting site of the highly endangered Green Turtles in Hong Kong.

Provision for the Food Safety and Public Health Programme in 2000-01 is \$339.7 million. It is not possible to directly compare this with the expenditure under the Provisional Municipal Councils (PMCs), reasons being:

- (a) the Food Safety and Public Health is a new programme which only came into being on 1 January 2000 after the re-organization of municipal services. Veterinary public health and risk assessment and communication are new and additional functions which were not performed by the former PMCs;
- (b) as the PMCs were financially autonomous, all expenditure pertaining to areas under their jurisdiction was borne by them. However, with the reorganisation of municipal services and the setting up of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD), part of such expenditure now comes under other Heads of expenditure e.g. building maintenance is now funded under Head 25 (Architectural Services Department);
- (c) for the year 1999-2000, there was only nine months' expenditure under the PMCs as the reorganization of municipal services took place on 1 January 2000; and
- (d) the PMCs did not classify expenditure in the same way as FEHD's programme areas. Direct comparison cannot therefore be made.

For the reasons stated above, we have no basis to comment whether savings have been achieved or not.

The estimate of 121 000 tests on water samples for 2000 is mainly based on the forecast of requests for analytical support from the Environmental Protection Department. While the estimate of workload from the Environmental Protection Department for 1999 was 119 000 tests, the Government Laboratory actually completed 127 926 tests on water samples for a variety of pollution indicators including nutrients, trace metals, and the more complicated trace organics analysis such as pesticides, polychlorinated biphbenyls, polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons and dioxins. Depending on the complexity of analytical work, different pollution indicators require different analytical procedures, resulting in different reporting time.

The analysis of trace organics in environmental samples is tedious and complicated and would require longer time to complete. In view of the on-going increase over the past years in trace organics analysis, a lower percentage of work completed within the pledged target reporting time is therefore anticipated. This rationale also accounts for the lower planned performance figures for 2000 when compared to the actual figures for 1999 for other areas of testing under this programme, such as air monitoring samples and field investigation samples.

We intend to collect, through the food consumption survey, data on types and amounts of food intake in order to establish the dietary pattern of the local population. The financial provision is \$1.4 million. The Food Research Laboratory of Food and Environmental Hygiene Department will conduct studies and researches on nutritional and chemical contents of commonly consumed food items for risk assessment and communication. The financial provision for the commissioning is \$2.9 million.

<u>Question</u> :

- (a) According to the reply to the question I raised in connection with the 1999-2000 Estimate, the Department of Health undertook in 1999-2000 to introduce the Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point System (HACCP) to 20% of the food premises by 2002. Will the Department revise this target after taking over the above work? If so, what are the reasons for such revision?
- (b) How many licensees of food premises were the targets of promotion of HACCP by the Department of Health in 1999-2000 and what percentage did they account for against the total number of licensed food premises? What is the expenditure in such area of work in 1999-2000 and the coming year?
- (c) Has the Department assessed whether there is any correlation between the increase in the number of target licensees on the promotion of HACCP and the decrease in the incidents of food poisoning? If not, how will the Department assess the effectiveness of such promotion work?

Asked by : Dr the Hon TANG Siu-tong, JP

Reply:

- (a) We shall maintain the target of introducing HACCP to 20% of the trade by the end of 2002.
- (b) In 1999, 3% (i.e. 600) of licencees of food premises was the target of promotion of HACCP. The estimated expenditure for 1999-2000 is \$3.2 million. A financial provision of \$4.8 million has been earmarked for 2000-01 to extend our coverage to 8% (i.e. 1,600) in 2000 of licencees of food premises.

(c) Our objective is to introduce and promote the adoption of HACCP by the food trade in the operation of their businesses. At this stage, we evaluate the effectiveness of the programme by assessing the licencees' knowledge and acceptance of HACCP through post-course questionnaires and follow up interviews.
