Question: As regards the crimes that get priorities in handling by the Police under

Asked by: The Hon Gary CHENG Kai-nam

Reply: (a) Whilst computer crime has multiplied in 1999 as compared with 1998, the nature and number of the offences as well as the associated damages were relatively mild when compared with many other categories of crime. It is therefore not listed as a key target of crime prevention and detection in the Controlling Officers' Report. However, noticing its rising trend with the increase in use of Internet in Hong Kong, the Police has been closely monitoring the situation and undertaking various measures to face the new challenge. In 1999, a wide range of public education programmes on awareness and prevention of computer-related crime were conducted by the Crime Prevention Bureau and Police Public Relations Bureau. Some of the events were organised in conjunction with the Education Department and Information Technology Services

Department (ITSD).

In addition, a Computer Crime Investigation Cadre (CCIC) comprising 83 officers from different formations was formed in December 1999 to assist in computer crime investigation in front-line formations. In January 2000, 11 officers have completed an advanced training in computer crime investigation and forensic examination of computers at the Hong Kong University of Science & Technology. The training facilitates an accreditation of the officers' expertise against computer-related crime. The educational and preventive measures will continue. In March, a Senior Superintendent was seconded to the Security Bureau to assist an Inter-departmental Working Group in studying legal issues pertinent to computer-related crime.

The Computer Crime Section (CCS) comprising 17 officers was formed within the Commercial Crime Bureau since 1993. It is responsible for investigation into computer-related crime that is complex or transnational. The CCS also provides technical support in other investigations related to computer and will identify any deficiencies in existing legislation. Expansion of the CCS in 2000 is being studied, and the CCIC may also expand if necessary. Such an expansion will be met within existing resources allocation. In addition, \$2.7 million will be spent to establish a Forensic Examination and Computer Crime Investigation Laboratory in 2000-01 in order to enhance the current examination capability. Besides, other bureaux/departments will continue to take necessary actions to combat computer-related crime. For example, ITSD will continue to organize publicity activities to raise public awareness on computer security and the proper use of the Internet.

Given the projected total number of 10,120 arrests in 2000 in this connection, the corresponding numbers of illegal immigrants entering by land and by sea are estimated to be 5,560 (i.e. decreased by 15.75%) and

4,560 (i.e. decreased by 18.13%) respectively.

The increase of 12.5% in the number of officers receiving internal security training must be seen in the context of training cycle. The Police Tactical Unit training cycle covers a period of three years. Over this period, a total of 26 companies will receive training: eight in the first year, nine in the second year and nine in the third year. The 12.5% increase in 2000 represents the move from year 1 to year 2 whereby one additional company receives training. In year 4, a new cycle will begin and there will be a reduction of about 12.5% as one less company will receive training.

The Hon. member may rest assured that there is no undue anxiety on the part of Government in respect of public order situation, and there is absolutely nothing to do with the Legco election in September.

The Police Force continues to run a publicity campaign which aims at educating the public to use the 999 system properly. This should reduce the number of nuisance and non-emergency calls made to 999 so that calls involving genuine emergencies can be handled in a more efficient and timely manner. The decrease in estimates is attributable to the anticipation of the success of this campaign.

As shown in the Controlling Officer's Report, the figure under "Emergency Calls" consists of calls involving "genuine emergencies" as well as cases that can be handled by the Police Force according to normal schedule or can be diverted to other departments for assistance. The number of "genuine emergency" calls per year has been consistent and is expected to remain so in 2000/01. The decrease of "Emergency Calls" in the 2000/01 Draft Estimates actually reflects a drop in the number of calls which are not "genuine emergencies".

Implementing the project within three years will result in early benefits to the public and is more efficient than spreading the project over a longer period.

The former deals with the more complex or serious cases and provides technical support in other investigations. December 1999, a Computer Crime Investigation Cadre (CCIC) comprising 83 officers from different formations was formed to assist in computer crime investigations in front-line formations. 2000, 11 officers have completed an advanced training in computer crime investigation and forensic examination of computers at the Hong Kong University of Science & Technology. In March 2000, a Senior Superintendent was seconded to the Security Bureau to assist the Interdepartmental Working Group in studying legal issues pertinent to computer crime.

(b) The emerging issues of computer-related crimes have posed new challenges to the Police. The Police Force constantly reviews its policy, strategy and resource adequacy in order to strengthen its capability in tackling the growth of computer-related crime. Additional resource requirements for the CCS are being examined and the CCIC may expand if necessary. Any expansion plan in 2000-01 can be met within existing resources allocation should the need arise. In addition, \$2.7 million will be spent to establish a Forensic Examination and Computer Crime Investigation Laboratory in 2000-01 in order to enhance the current examination capability.

Reply:

Compared with 1998, 1999 registered a slight decrease in detection rate. Such a decrease is mainly due to the changes in crime pattern such as the increase in the report of quick cash crimes e.g. pick-pocketing, deception, theft from vehicles and crimes in relation to debt-collection activities. These crimes are relatively difficult to be detected according to past experience.

Based on the crime trend, crime pattern and detection rate of 1999, the Police have made a slight downward adjustment (less than 1%) in the estimated figure of overall crimes detected in 2000. In order to strengthen our capability in tackling crimes, a 2.6% increase in the estimated provision under this programme has been requested.

Detection of a crime depends on a combination of factors, such as the complexity of the case, the availability and co-operation of witnesses, victims and members of the public, the evidence that can be gathered at the scene of a crime, etc. The detection rate only serves as an indicator of the extent of Police's success but is not a precise reflection of the efforts that went into the prevention and detection of crimes.

Reply:

In 2000-01, the Police Training School is expected to train 16 Probationary Inspectors (PI) and 160 Recruit Constables (RPC). Three one-hour training sessions on domestic violence are included in the training programme for both the RPC and PI. This is reinforced by another three one-hour training sessions during Regional Continuation Training.

2. Two one-hour training sessions on domestic violence are conducted during the Police Constables 5thyear continuation training course. A total of 960 officers will go through the continuation training course in the coming financial year.

- 3. The Training Development Bureau is also planning to design a training day package (including a video) on the handling of domestic violence. This will be delivered in the coming financial year and all front line officers will undergo this training.
- 4. All the above training will be provided with the existing available resources and no additional fund will be required.

Unlike calls to the 999 service, most of the calls made to the Police Hotlines relate to crime information of a confidential nature and are anonymous. The information provided often requires prolonged and detailed analysis to determine their validity.

Compared with 1998, 1999 registered a slight decrease in detection rate. Such a decrease is mainly due to the changes in crime pattern such as the increase in the report of quick cash crimes e.g. pick-pocketing, deception, theft from vehicles and crimes in relation to debt-collection activities. Based on the crime trend in 1999, the Police has estimated the number of overall crimes reported and detected for 2000 - 2001.

Detection of a crime depends on a number of factors, such as the complexity of the case, the availability and co-operation of victims, witnesses and members of the public, the evidence that can be gathered etc. The detection rate only serves as an indicator of the extent of Police success in preventing and detecting crimes. The actual rate will fluctuate depending on a combination of factors mentioned above.

The two major criteria to be considered for hiring of consultants include -

- (a) where there is no expertise in the Police Force to provide the required technical skills; and
- (b) where it is essential that the process must be conducted independently for credibility of findings.

The Police Force is committed to improving the quality of service. In this connection, the Police Force has commissioned the consultancy services referred to in items 769 - Hire of consultancy for conducting staff attitude survey and 770 - Hire of consultancy on implementation of the Force Strategy on Service Quality under Subhead 700.

The main objective is to assist the Police Force in designing and organising Forcewide culture change programmes. Under item 770, the consultant conducted researches and surveys to collate opinion of staff and public to assist the Force management to review and work out its strategy on service quality. Together with the views from the management side collected under the management survey conducted under item 769, the consultancy also provides advice and assistance to the Police Service Quality Wing in reviewing and drawing up service quality programmes.

Improvement on service quality is a continuous task and requires external experience in working out the overall strategy and long-term programmes. It therefore meets the criteria for hiring of consultancy service. After the completion of the services by the consultant, evaluation reports on the performance of the consultants will be prepared to ensure that the services provided are value for money.
