Appointment of judges of the Court of Final Appeal

Thank you for your letter of 13 June. I confirm that Ms Miranda Chiu and the undersigned will attend the Special meeting on 17 June 2000 to continue discussion on "Appointment of Judges of the CFA".

- 2. To facilitate discussion, I forward herewith at Annex I a LegCo brief as requested. The additional information requested by the Panel has been incorporated in the brief.

- (iv) the Administration's Paper on the "Current Appointment Exercise of the Seven CFA Judges"; and
- (v) the attached LegCo brief.

Copies of the foregoing materials are annexed for your ease of reference.

- 4. The Chief Executive has also given permission for the Administration to explain to Members that he also noted that the main reason for dealing with the seven appointments now rather than to leave the matter to sometime later, is that it would be most detrimental to the CFA's functioning and its standing if the making of the new appointments had to wait for the new Lego session to deal with the endorsement. We have outlined the detailed dates of appointments of these judges in the LegCo brief and they will also be repeated in the speech to be made by the Chief Secretary for Administration when moving the motion.
- 5. I hope Members would appreciate that the Administration has a limit in providing information with regard to how the statutory requirements of Sections 3(5B) and 3(5C) of the JORC were complied with, the list of eligible persons and the deliberations of JORC leading to its recommendation of the seven appointments, since it involves the names of and discussions concerning individual eligible persons involved in this exercise.
