Chinese Medicine Practitioners (Fees) Regulation (Made by the Chief Executive in Council under section 161(1) of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance (Cap. 549))

1. Commencement

This Regulation shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Secretary for Health and Welfare by notice in the Gazette.

2. Fees

The fees set out in the Schedule are payable under the Ordinance in respect of the matters set out in column 2 of the Schedule.

3. Disposal of fees received

All fees set out in the Schedule that have been received shall be paid into the general revenue.
